- 2. Please kindly inform whether such ban or prohibitory order is applicable to 3rd parties who are
 - a. Jointly producing such documentaries with BBC? Or
 - b. Plan to subsequently market the documentaries to BBC or any of its affiliates?
- 3. Please kindly inform whether visa and permits of foreign citizens/journalists will be affected if the proposed documentary is:
 - a. broadcasted or aired on BBC or any of its affiliates channels? or
 - b. proposed documentary is subsequently gets aired on BBC or any of its affiliates channels?

- c) Kindly provide the information to each point <u>separately</u>. Please do not club the information to the points, even if the information is repeated.
- d) Whether Information is Required by post or in person: by post/Soft Copy In case of post: by Speed Post.
- e) The applicant kindly submits that the above information sought does not fall within the exemptions U/s 8 of RTI Act, 2005 and to the best of my knowledge it pertains to your esteemed office in your statutory capacity as PIO u/s 5 (1) of RTI Act read with 5(4) and 5(5) of the RTI Act, 2005.
- f) The applicant kindly submits that if the requested information does not pertain to your department, then it is requested to please follow the provisions of Section 6(3) of the RTI Act, 2005 and kindly also intimate the applicant through registered/speed post to whom you are forwarding / transferring the application as prescribed in RTI Act 2005.
- g) Applicant may be supplied information under proactive disclosure under section 4 (1) (b) of RTI Act of your office / department.
- h) And also mention the name and address of Appellate authority in reply as per Section 7 and 19 of RTI Act 2005.
- i) If my request or part of request is rejected by PIO then provide reason for rejection as per Section 7 (8) of RTI Act.
- j) Kindly provide information on above mentioned questions.
