Please refer to your RTI application dated 27.4.2015 received in this Division. Reply to your query related to this Division is as under:

2. Article 23 of the Chapter of the United Nations states that "the Security Council shall consist of fifteen Members of the United Nations. The Republic of China, France, the Union of Soviet Socialist Republics, the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland, and the United States of America shall be permanent members of the Security Council. The General Assembly shall elect ten other Members of the United Nations to be non-permanent members of the Security Council."

3. Further, Article 108 of the Chapter of UN states that "amendments to the present Charter shall come into force for all Members of the United Nations when they have been adopted by a vote of two thirds of the members of the General Assembly and ratified in accordance with their respective constitutional processes by two thirds of the Members of the United Nations, including all permanent members of the Security Council."

4. Article 23 & 108 of the Charter of the UN infers that the composition of the Security Council is prescribed by the UN Charter, according to which certain specified nations have permanent seats. Hence, there is no question of a seat being offered and India declining it or there being documentation to this effect.

5. There continues to be wide support for India's candidature for a permanent seat on the UN Security Council. The Government continues to make active efforts, including discussions with various countries and participation in the debates on Security Council reform at the United Nations, to mobilise further support for India's candidature.

6.
