

INDIA-AUSTRIA BILATERAL RELATIONS

Historical foundations:

Diplomatic relations between India and Austria were established on 10 November 1949.

High Level Visits

2. Prime Minister visited Austria from 09-10 July 2024. This visit coincided with 75 years of establishment of diplomatic relations. In addition to talks with President Alexander Van der Bellen and Chancellor Karl Nehammer, Prime Minister also addressed an India-Austria Business Meeting and interacted with prominent Austrians, including Indologists. He also addressed the Indian Community in Austria. A Joint Statement on 'Enhanced India-Austria Partnership' was issued.
3. Prime Minister met then Austrian Chancellor, H.E. Mr. Alexander Schallenberg on 30 October 2021, on the sidelines of COP-26 In Glasgow.
4. Prime Minister had a telephonic conversation with President H.E. Dr. Alexander Van der Bellen on 26 May 2020.
5. Austrian Chancellor Christian Kern met Prime Minister for a bilateral meeting in St. Petersburg on 2nd June 2017 on the side lines of the St. Petersburg International Economic Forum (SPIEF).
6. Hon'ble President Pratibha Devisingh Patil paid a State visit to Austria from October 4-7, 2011.
7. Hon'ble President K.R. Narayanan paid the first State Visit from India to Austria in November 1999. This was reciprocated by the Austrian President, Dr. Heinz Fischer, in February 2005.
8. Prime Minister Indira Gandhi visited Austria in 1983. This was reciprocated by Austrian Chancellor Fred Sinowatz in 1984.

Recent Ministerial level engagements and visits

9. External Affairs Minister (EAM) met the Federal Minister for European and International Affairs, Ms. Beate Meinl-Reisinger, on the sidelines of the UNGA on 26 September 2025 and the Munich Security Conference on 14 February 2026. He also had a telephonic conversation with Federal Minister for European and International Affairs, Ms. Beate Meinl-Reisinger on 14 May 2025.
10. EAM Dr. S. Jaishankar visited Austria from 31 December 2022 to 03 January 2023.

11. Austrian Foreign Minister, Mr. Alexander Schallenberg visited India from 19-21 March 2022. In 2022, the two Foreign Ministers have also met in Munich on 18 February 2022, in Bratislava on 02nd June 2022 (GLOBSEC Forum) and in New York on 20 September 2022 (UN General Assembly). In 2023 the two foreign Ministers also met in Stockholm (EU-Indo Pacific Ministerial forum) and in New York (78th Session of UNGA).

12. Austrian Foreign Minister Dr. Karin Kneissl visited India from 25-26 February 2019 to mark the 70th anniversary of diplomatic relations between India and Austria.

Other Ministerial level visits

13. Minister for Petroleum and Natural Gas, Shri Hardeep Singh Puri visited Vienna from 08-10 July 2025 for 9th OPEC International Seminar. During the visit he held bilateral meetings with Secretary General of OPEC and Ministers from Nigeria, UAE and Kuwait.

14. Minister of Finance & Corporate Affairs, Smt. Nirmala Sitharaman visited Austria from 09-10 April, 2025. She called on the Federal Chancellor of Austria. She had bilateral meetings with Federal Minister of Finance and federal Minister of European and International Affairs. She also held bilateral meeting with the Federal Minister of Economy, Energy and Tourism and participated in Business Roundtable. She also addressed Indian diaspora at a community event.

15. Federal Minister of Labour and Economy Martin Kocher paid a working visit to India from February 19th to 23rd, 2024. He was accompanied by 38 Austrian companies. In New Delhi, he had bilateral meeting Shri Piyush Goyal, Minister of Commerce and Industry and participated in the Raisina Dialogue and took part in CII's Europe Business & Sustainability Conclave. India- Austria start up bridge was also launched during the visit.

16. Minister of State for External Affairs & Culture, Smt. Meenakshi Lekhi transited through Austria on 02 December 2023 during her visit to Budapest and Bulgaria from 29 November to 01 December 2023.

17. Minister of Petroleum and Natural Gas & Housing and Urban Affairs, Shri Hardeep Singh Puri visited Vienna for India-OPEC dialogue on 08-09 November 2023. He also had meeting with Mr. Haitham Al-Ghais, Secretary General, OPEC.

18. Minister of Road Transport and Highways, Shri Nitin Gadkari visited Austria to participate in INTERALPIN 2023 Fair in Innsbruck from 18-21 April 2023.

19. Minister of State (I/C) for Power, Coal, New & Renewable Energy and Mines, Shri. Piyush Goyal, visited Vienna in May 2017 to participate in the Vienna Energy Forum. Minister of State for Petroleum and Natural Gas, Shri Dharmendhra Pradhan visited Vienna in May 2017 for the second India-OPEC

dialogue. Sh. Pradhan led the Indian delegation to participate in the 7th OPEC International Seminar held in Vienna from 19-20 June 2018.

20. Gen (retd.) V.K. Singh, Minister of State for External Affairs visited Vienna in November 2014 to attend the UN Conference on Landlocked Developing Countries (LLDC). Minister of State for Petroleum and Natural Gas, Shri Dharmendhra Pradhan visited Vienna in June 2015 to attend the 6th OPEC seminar.

21. Minister of State for External Affairs, Smt. Preneet Kaur led the Indian delegation at the 5th Global Forum of United Nations Summit of Alliance of Civilizations (UNAOC) held in Vienna in February 2013. Indian Minister of Culture Smt. Chandresh Kumari visited Austria in April 2013. Dr. Reinhold Lopatka, State Secretary in the Austrian Foreign Ministry led the delegation to India on 11-12 November 2013 to attend the 11th Asia-Europe Foreign Ministers' Meeting (ASEM-FMM) in New Delhi.

22. Minister for Overseas Indian Affairs, Shri Vayalar Ravi, visited Austria from 3-4 February 2013.

23. Austrian Federal Minister for Transport, Innovation and Technology, Ms. Doris Bures visited India from 1-4 October 2012. Austrian Federal Minister for Environment, Forestry, Agriculture and Water Management, Mr. Nikolaus Berlakovich visited India from 16-19 October 2012 to attend a meeting of Conference of State Parties to the Convention on Biological Diversity held in Hyderabad.

24. Austrian Vice Chancellor Mr. Josef Pröll and Minister of Economy Dr. Reinhold Mitterlehner visited India from 17-20 February 2010.

25. The Austrian Parliamentary Delegation led by the President of the Austrian National Council Mr. Wolfgang Sobotka, including President of the Federal Council Ms. Christine Schwarz-Fuchs visited India from 12-16 March 2022.

26. A Parliamentary delegation from India led by the Speaker Lok Sabha Shri Om Birla and including Deputy Chairman of Rajya Sabha visited Vienna from 07-10 September 2021.

27. Lok Sabha Speaker, Smt. Meira Kumar led a Parliamentary delegation during the visit to Austria in 2009. President of National Council of Austrian Parliament Mrs. Barbara Prammer visited in 2011 and in 2012 to attend the Seventh meeting of Women Speakers of Parliament on the topic of 'Gender Aware Parliaments'.

29. **Indo-Austria Bilateral Trade:** Total bilateral trade for 2025 was USD 3.47 billion. Indian exports to Austria was USD 1.73 billion and imports were USD 1.74 billion. (Source: Statistik Austria)

Indian key exports to Austria: Electronic Goods, Apparels, Textile, Footwear, Rubber articles, Vehicles & Railways parts, Electrical machinery and Mechanical appliances.

30. According to the Austrian National Bank, India has received cumulative direct investment of 851 million Euros till 2024. India's investment in Austria stood at 982 million Euros till 2024.

31. To foster innovation and entrepreneurship between the countries, India-Austria Startup Bridge was launched in February 2024.

32. A TU Austria (TCSITAT) initiative was established with Indian Universities for technological Collaboration in 2025. The objective is to foster sustainable academic & research collaborations and attracting young talent from India to study in Austria.

Culture and people-to-people ties

33. The Indo-Austrian cultural relations have a long tradition dating back to 16th century when Balthasar Springer traveled from Tyrol in 1505 to India along with the third Portuguese fleet. The Austrian tradition of Indology began in a period renowned for its distinguished philologist and archaeologist between 1825-1920. The teaching of Sanskrit at Vienna University started in 1845. In 1880 an independent chair for Indology was established in the University of Vienna. Following a brief interruption between 1938- 1955, the Chair became an independent department, now known as Institute for South Asian, Tibetan and Buddhist Studies at University of Vienna.

34. Philosopher-poet and Nobel Laureate Rabindranath Tagore visited Vienna in 1921 and 1926. Gurudev Rabindranath Tagore's famous lecture in 1921 'The religion of the forest', portrayed the value of getting closer to nature and learning union and compassion.

35. Reputed artists of India and Austria have performed in each other's countries for the past several decades. These include - Ustad Amjad Ali Khan, Zakir Hussain, Pandit Hariprasad Chaurasia, Pandit Vishwa Mohan Bhatt. Maestro Zubin Mehta continues to be associated with Vienna Philharmonic and has given New Year performances at the famous Music Verein, including the concert in September 2022 and March 2026.

36. Several Bollywood films are being filmed in Austria, given its scenic locales, which includes Andhadhun (2026), Kantara (2026), Sui Dhaga (2026), Tiger 3 (2021), Sahoo (2019), Tiger Zinda Hai (2017), Ae Dil Hai Mushkil (2016), Prem Ratan Dhan Payo (2015) etc.

37. Ayurveda, the Indian traditional system of medicine has been widely acknowledged and practiced in Austria. The holistic approach of Yoga in health care and wellbeing has led many Austrians to embrace Yoga and is testified by the presence of many Yoga schools in Vienna and other Austrian cities.

38. The Comprehensive Migration and Mobility Partnership Agreement (CMMPA) was signed in September 2023 providing a framework for mobility between the two countries.

39. **Indian community:** There are an estimated over 13510 Indians living in Austria. There are over 730 Indian students pursuing their higher education in Austria and the number is set to rise.
