**India – Republic of Gabon Relations**

**Overview**

In the 1980s to 1990s, Gabon began to diversify its partners, both to reinforce domestic security, and to pursue the economic cooperation for its development objectives. Since 2009, under the leadership of the current President, Ali Bongo Ondimba, Gabon has set itself the objective of becoming an emerging country by 2025. This “emerging” Gabon vision has three pillars: development of an industrial base; development of service sector; and development of a green and blue economy. The pursuit and implementation of this vision is the main objective of Gabon’s foreign policy today. Gabon seeks to promote direct investment in various sectors, namely logistics infrastructures, energy and water, agriculture, value-added local processing, services and tourism, and social programmes such as housing for its people.

Like most countries of Africa, Gabon seeks to diversify its external relations beyond Europe and America, relationships that today are considered not “really equal”. On the contrary, South-South Cooperation is increasingly seen as mutually beneficial, devoid of interference in internal affairs and non-prescriptive. And this is where, Gabon’s push for greater engagement and partnership with India, comes in; the India-Africa Forum Summit providing the necessary framework for fostering greater understanding and trust. Moreover, India and Gabon have traditionally enjoyed warm and friendly relations dating back to the pre-independence era of Gabon. Gabonese embassy in India was established in New Delhi on 4<sup>th</sup> April 2008.

There is, nevertheless, need to boost the somewhat stagnating relations and work towards better understanding of each other’s concerns, closer coordination of positions, especially in the international forums and on issues that are of importance to our respective countries.

**Bilateral visits**

With respect to the Goodwill ships’ visits from India, Mission recently gave approval to the Ministry of Defense’s proposed Operational Turn around by Indian Navy units in 56 countries (For FY 2022-23 to 2025-26).

## **MOUs/ Agreements**

1. During the bilateral visit of the then Foreign Minister of DRC, Mr. Pacome Moubelet Bouveya, to India in June 2017 (As mentioned in bilateral visits), a **Protocol on Foreign Office Consultations** was signed. The first ever India-Gabon FOC is expected to take place on 22<sup>nd</sup> November 2022.
2. Recently in April 2022, Gabonese Investment Promotion Minister has stated that Gabon should be able to sign a Bilateral Trade and Investment Treaty with India, in coming months. \*\*\*
3. During the visit of Hon'ble Vice President of India to Libreville on 30<sup>th</sup> May – 1<sup>st</sup> June 2022, two MOUs were signed between India and Gabon
  - MOU between SSIFS and Gabonese Ministry of Foreign Affairs for training of their diplomats. Vice President also announced training of 20 Gabonese diplomats this year at SSIFS.
  - Agreement for establishing JCM was also signed.

## **Cooperation in multilateral forums**

Gabon has collaborated with India in international forums and regularly supported our candidatures whenever required. It was one among the first countries to sign and ratify the ISA framework agreement. Both India and Gabon supported each other's bid for non-permanent membership of UNSC (India (2021-22) & Gabon (2022-23)). Hence, both countries will be a non-permanent member of UNSC in 2022, after which India's 2-year term will come to an end. Gabon also supported India during the International Law Commission's elections in November 2021, for which India's candidate was Dr. Bimal Patel. With respect to India's push for becoming a Permanent Member of UNSC, Gabon does not have any official stance.

## **Lines of Credit**

The implementation/utilization of the Lines of Credit have not seen much success in Gabon. In March 2007 GOI approved a Line of Credit of \$14.5 million for a housing project in Bikele near Libreville to construct 300 houses and 4 amenities. The project got stalled due to differences between the Government of Gabon and the Indian consortium engaged for the project on issues such as release of funds, grant of visa/residence permit to Indian workers, etc. Exim Bank had released US\$ 4.35 million for this project. The Government of Gabon has repaid the amount drawn and interest thereon.

GOI had extended another Line of Credit worth US\$ 67.19 million in 2011 to rehabilitate and upgrade the broadcasting facilities of Gabon. However, due to non-utilization of the LoC, it was finally annulled in December 2017. Currently, there is no active (live) LOC to Gabon.

## **Capacity Building Programme**

### **ITEC**

To date, **23 ITEC slots** have been utilized by Gabon.

### **ICCR**

With respect to ICCR scholarships, in last 5 years, 13 slots have been offered to Gabon. However, none have been utilized. No ICCR troupes have visited Gabon so far.

We need to discuss and develop a better and quicker way of exchanging information, publicizing and processing the applications, for full utilization of the GOI offers.

11 Gabonese diplomats participated in the 1st Special Course for Diplomats from Francophone Central & West African Countries held at FSI in October 2019. Mission has

recently sent a Note Verbale to Gabonese Foreign Ministry to sign an MOU with SSIFS, for training of their diplomats.

In October 2022, one Gabonese diplomat participated in the 3-weeks **long 69<sup>th</sup> PCFD course** for Foreign Diplomats at SSIFS, New Delhi.

### **Other development projects**

In September 2018, GoI announced a grant aid of **USD one million** for Gabon's project for Strengthening climate information and early warning systems, under the India-UN Development Partnership Fund.

Gabon was among the first 15 African countries to implement the Pan African e-network project. Tele-education, Tele-medicine and VVIP connectivity have been set up in Libreville under this project. Hon'ble MOS V Muraleedharan and the then DRC's Foreign Minister reviewed the finalization process the draft MOU on e-VBAB project during their virtual bilateral meet in Dec. 2020 (**Draft MOU not finalized yet**).

A Vocational Training Centre was to be set up in Gabon, under the Plan of Action agreed with the African Union following the first India Africa Forum Summit in New Delhi in April 2008.

**Mahatma Gandhi Convention Center** – GoI proposed for setting up MGCC in Gabon in 2019. Due to COVID-19, MEA has decided in April 2021 to put on hold all pending MGCC projects.

### **Indian Investments**

Over the last two decades, many Indian companies have invested in Gabon.

(i) Oil India Ltd. [OIL], in partnership with Indian Oil Corporation Ltd. (IOCL), is conducting oil exploration in the Shakti Block, which has an area of 3761 sq km. The block is located 150 to 180 km southeast of Libreville the capital city of Gabon. OIL is on Phase II of exploration which is projected to continue till 2020/23. While oil has been discovered, the offshore and onshore blocks on the western and south-western side are said to be more productive and possibilities of acquiring blocks in those areas could be considered in the future. As on 30<sup>th</sup> Sept 2021 the consortium has invested \$157 million in Gabon.

(ii) In 2010, Bharti Airtel acquired Zain Communications Network.

(iii) Around 54 Indian companies are said to be operating out of the Special Economic Zone NKOK.

(iv) Greenply Gabon SA has invested around \$20-25 million in wood processing and wooden products manufacturing (especially veneer sheets manufacturing, one of the biggest producers). It will also soon be investing in new Special Industrial Zone (ZIS) Ikolo, which was created in June 2021, for wood industry.

(v) Alpha Centauri Mining SA has also major investments in mining with over USD 20 millions. (Based in Gabon but owner is Indian citizen)

(vi) La Sante Pharmaceutique SA has invested around USD 35 millions in Pharmaceuticals industry. (Its parent company is Indian).

(vii) Nouvelle Gabon Mining has around USD 50 million in Manganese mining (Gabonese company but has Indian chairman).

Besides these companies, there are many smaller companies working in sectors like wholesale and retail of FMCG products, metal recycling, logistics, transportation of goods etc, having investments of less than \$2 million.

Majority of the Indian companies are working in veneer manufacturing. Gabon has become an attractive investment destination for the wood industry, in recent years. In November 2021, Govt. of Gabon and GSEZ SA relating to the development and operation of a new Special Investment Zone (ZIS) of Ikolo (created to bring investments in wood related industry), situated in Moyen- Ogooué province. Indian company Greenply Middle East (majority shareholder in Greenply Gabon) became the first investor in the zone after it signed an agreement with the Gabonese State in that regard.

It has also been seeking Indian investments in various fields including Ammonia-Urea Fertilizer Project; Manganese; and Wood Industry. Rashtriya Chemicals & Fertilizers Ltd. (RCF) visited Gabon in 2018.

MOIL was considering investment in the manganese sector in Gabon. A MOIL delegation led by a Joint Secretary level officer visited Gabon from 25-30 November 2018 to explore the possibility of acquiring manganese ore mines. Gabon has also been trying to attract Indian investments in Railways, to connect mining regions and SEZ with port. Few years ago, a detailed feasibility study was done by RITES for one of the proposed routes.

## **Trade Relations**

Gabon has large oil reserves, mineral and other natural resources. It is the world's second largest producer of manganese. There is a lot of potential for bilateral cooperation. India's commodity giant, 3F Oil Palm Agrotech Ltd was reportedly planning in 2016 to invest \$200 million on a giant palm oil project in Gabon.

In August 2022, the Indian Economic and Trade Organization and the Gabonese Embassy in India launched the **India-Gabon Business Council** in New Delhi to accelerate the bi-lateral trade relations.

The export target for Gabon (as part of the overall TARGET 400), for the year 2021-22, was \$69 million. However, the exports only reached about 76% of the target.

**COVID-19 and Bilateral relations**

With regards to the mutual recognition of vaccine certificates, Gabonese Foreign Ministry recently, in April 2022, stated that the Indian vaccines are recognized in Gabon and asked for a sample of Indian vaccination certificates. Mission has already forwarded the same to the Gabonese Foreign Ministry.

**People to people ties**

There are around 1000 Indians living in Gabon; most of them are floating population, engaged mainly in infrastructure projects, trading, export of timber and metal scrap, mining of manganese, travel and tours etc. India also extends e-Visa facility to the Gabonese nationals (holding ordinary passports). Another way for the Gabonese people to apply for Indian visa is through the Honorary Consul General’s office, who then sends

the request to the Embassy of India, Kinshasa via courier. Indian representative in Gabon is an Honorary Consul General, Mr. John Rupchandani, appointed by MEA in 2004.
